New Delhi: Road crashes in India claimed 426 lives per day or 18 every hour, which is the highest ever in any calendar year, reports Dipak Dash. At close to 1.56 lakh road fatalities recorded during the last year, it surpassed the number of people killed during the prepandemic year of 2019, indicating how reducing road deaths remains a big challenge.

While the rising number of road fatalities is a big concern, the data released by the National Crime Records Bureau has pointed to a worrying trend of the consistent increase in the share of two-wheeler occupant and pedestrian deaths in the country in recent years. The data show that out of every 100 people killed in road crashes, at least 44 were two-wheeler occupants. Their overall number stood at 69,240, an increase of 18% more than 2019, Tamil Nadu alone had nearly 12% share of the all two-wheeler deaths, followed by U.P. (10%).

A comparative analysis of last four years data shows that the share of two-wheeler occupants' death has increased from 35.7% in 2018 to 44.5% in 2021. The spike has been recorded despite the share of two-wheelers in total vehicular population remaining almost unchanged at 73-75% since 2014. Two-wheelers still remain the most preferred and affordable mode for transport across urban and rural areas. Two-wheelers have no feature to protect occupants except for enforcement of rules to wear helmets.
